Wednesday March 1st. - Ash Wednesday.

Ash Wednesday is one of the most popular and important holy days in the liturgical calendar. Ash Wednesday opens Lent, a season of fasting and prayer. Ash Wednesday takes place 46 days before Easter Sunday, and is mainly observed by Catholics, although many other Christians observe it too. Ash Wednesday comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the head. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us. As the priest applies the ashes to a person's forehead, he speaks the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Alternatively, the priest may speak the words, "Repent and believe in the Gospel."

Ashes also symbolize grief, in this case, grief that we have sinned and caused division from God. Writings from the Second-century Church refer to the wearing of ashes as a sign of penance. Priests administer ashes during Mass and all are invited to accept the ashes as a visible symbol of penance. All Christians and non-Christians are welcome to receive the ashes.

The **ASHES** are made from the blessed palms used in the **Palm Sunday** celebration of the previous year. The ashes are blessed with Holy Water and are scented by exposure to incense. While the ashes symbolize penance and contrition, they are also a reminder that God is gracious and merciful to those who call on Him with repentant hearts. His Divine Mercy is of utmost importance during the season of Lent, and the Church calls on us to seek that mercy during the entire Lenten season with reflection, prayer and penance.

Spiritual Ways of Living Lent.

Private Prayer - an addition of extra prayer to our daily lives, especially for those with busy lives

Attendance at Mass - Daily Mass is celebrated at 10am. each day - could you attend occasionally?

An additional act of penance or charity each day - to remind us of our hopes to be better people.

Reading Old or New Testaments - reading a section of the Bible each day brings us closer to the Lord.

Visit the Church each day - light a candle to honour the Lord and say a prayer.
